PROGRESS TOWARDS SUN 3.0 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES (SO)

- → SO.1 Strengthen and sustain strong policy and advocacy environments

 The Government has endorsed the Ninth National Socio-Economic

 Development Plan 2021–2025, which lists nutrition as a top priority. The
 third annualdissemination meeting for the National Information Platforms
 for Nutrition included multisectoral coordination and nutrition
 expenditure analysis and the linkage of WASH (water, sanitation and
 hygiene) and nutrition outcomes. The multisectoral nutrition platform,
 which includes the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Agriculture and
 Forestry, the Ministry of Education and Sports, the Ministry of Planning
 and Investment and the media, has engaged with development partners
 through meetings, forums, work agreements and partnerships to ensure
 that nutrition resources are aligned with the National Socio-Economic
 Development Plan.
- → SO.2 Develop and align shared country priorities for action

 The Department of Hygiene and Health Promotion in the Ministry of Health plays a coordinator role to ensure that interventions and activities in the national development plan are integrated into the sector development plans of key stakeholders. Workshops and meetings on integration have been conducted, and consensus has been achieved on a planning and reporting format for the development plan and for prioritizing the high levels of undernutrition in the country. Food security and poverty reduction are key focuses of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, while the Ministry of Education is focused on WASH in schools and on nutrition awareness. addressing the direct causes of malnutrition.

The Lao People's Democratic Republic is facing a large challenge related to nutrition capacity, which (along with good governance and technical knowledge) has been a focus of the Government in the past decade. In 2022, the National Socio-Economic Development Plan was disseminated nationwide. Nutrition-related training has been provided for local health volunteers and government units, including on infant and young child food product control and the integrated management of acute malnutrition. A training was held at Mahidol University in Thailand related to planning, reporting, budgeting and budget tracking for nutrition, with the idea that trainees will then conduct additional trainings for subnational stakeholders.

→ SO.4 Ensure governance of SUN that promotes country leadership and responsibilities of government, aligns the resources of all SUN Movement stakeholders behind country priorities and strengthens 360 mutual accountability

Kikeo Khaykhamphithoune, the Deputy Prime Minister and Chair of the National Committee for Nutrition, has provided guidance on: Improving leadership capacities at all levels; Ensuring that each sector integrates interventions and activities from the National Socio-Economic Development Plan into its own plans; Pushing forward the process of establishing a village nutrition model; Improving and increasing coordination among all sectors at all levels; Strengthening nutrition coordination mechanisms to successfully implement the activities necessary to achieve the nutrition indicators in the National Socio-Economic Development Plan; Increasing publicity about the necessity and importance of nutrition work in resource mobilization and development.
