89 countries are leading a global movement to end malnutrition in all its forms.

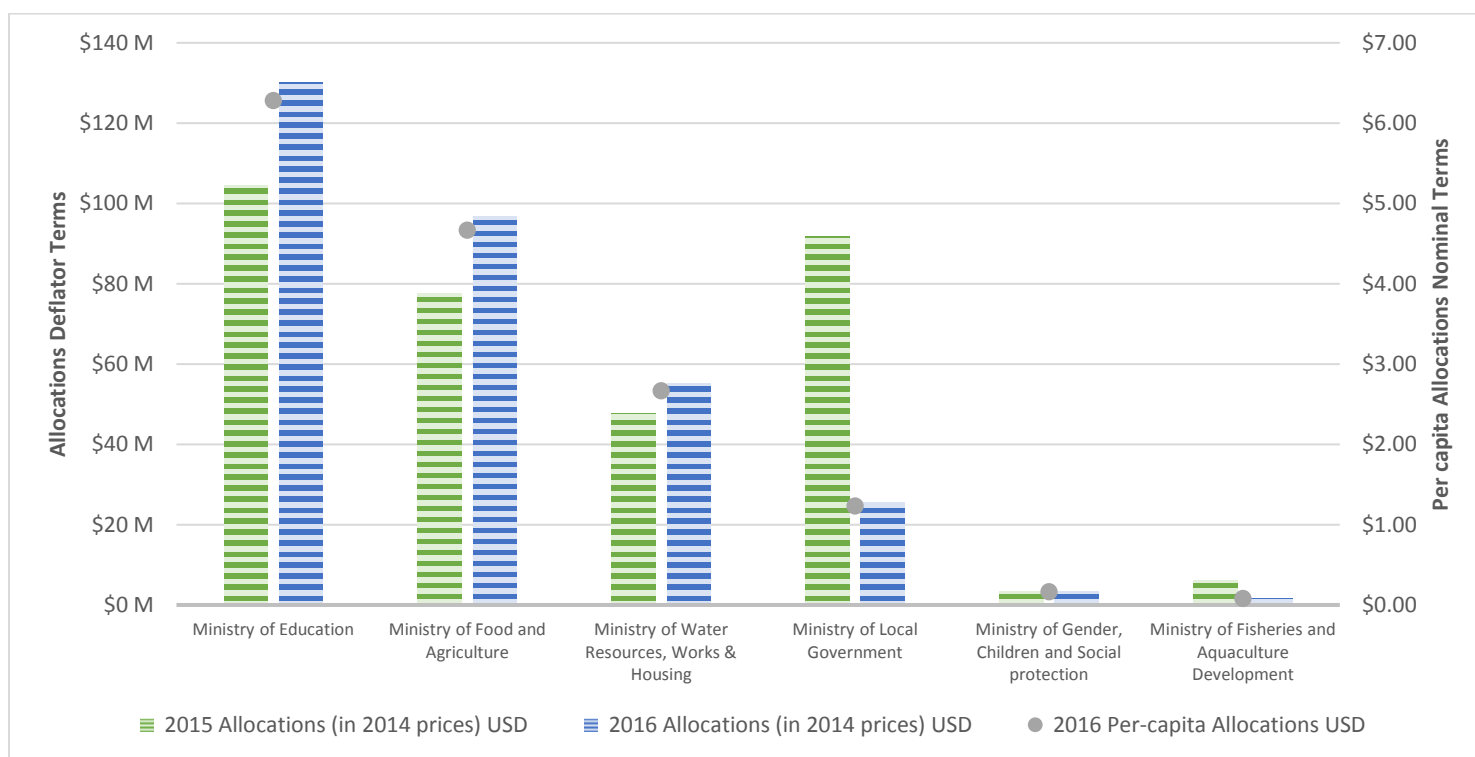
SUMMARY TABLE

Ghana’s budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2016 analysis identifies 112 nutrition-relevant programmes, of which 15 programmes received allocations in 2016. The 15 nutrition relevant programmes are overseen by six ministries, departments or agencies (MDAs), which allocated 15.10 per capita in 2016 (all estimates in USD).¹

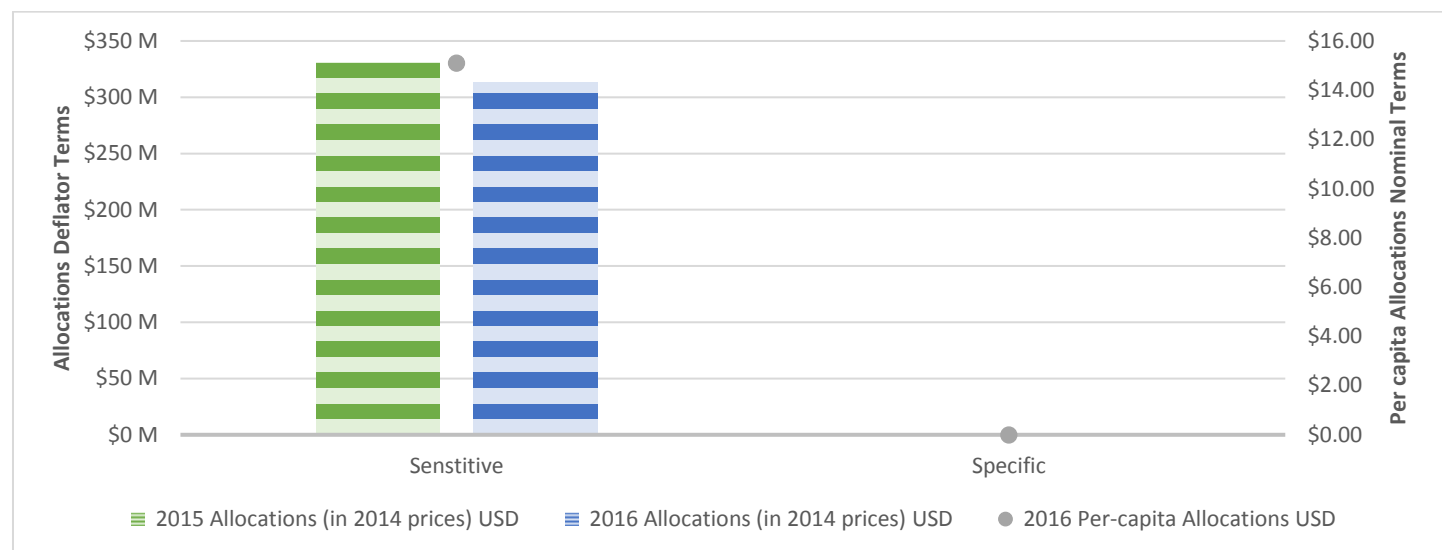

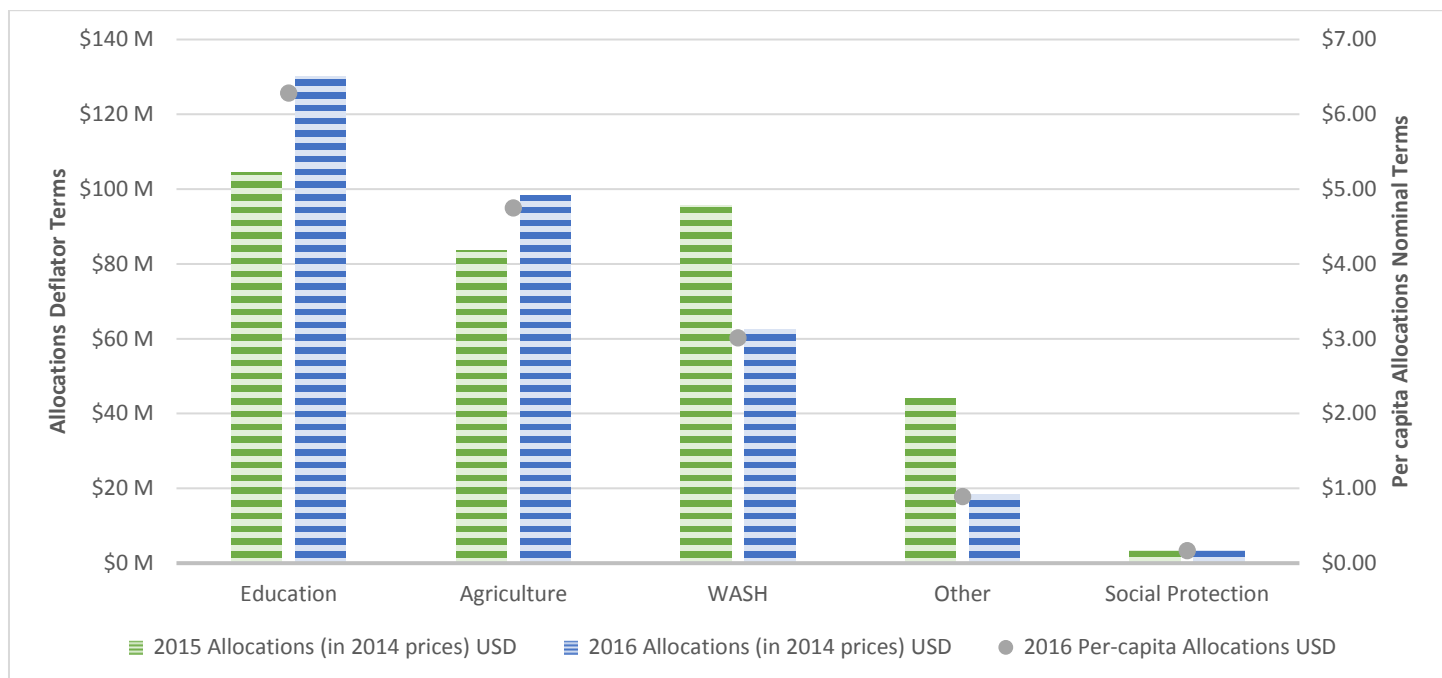

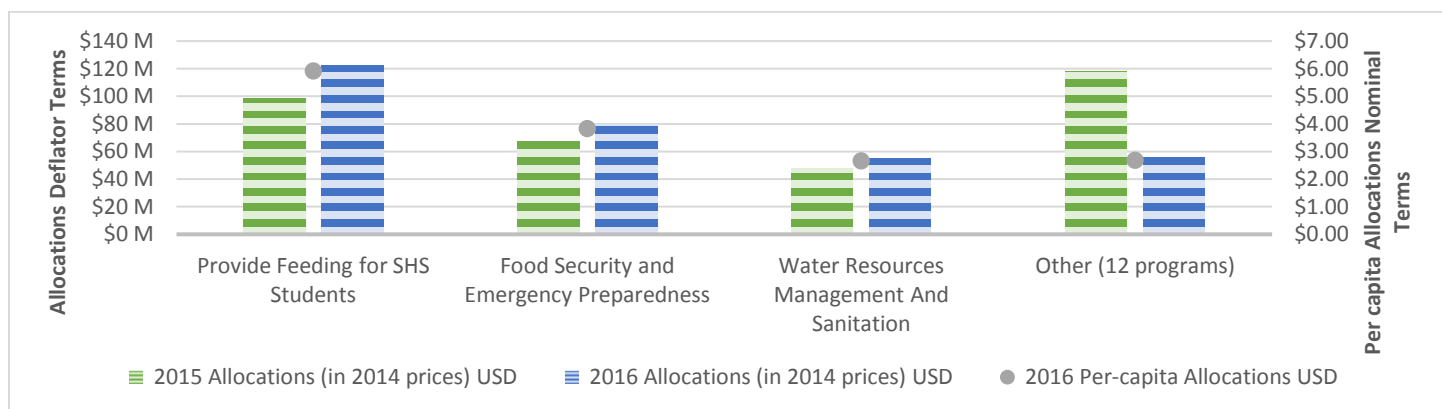
