SUMMARY TABLE

Pakistan's budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2016 analysis by Pakistan identifies 64 nutrition-related programmes, of which 54 programmes received allocations in 2015, totaling 10.49 per capita (all estimates in USD).¹

Trends in upper-bound nutrition-specific and sensitive budget allocations across provinces, 2015 (USD)





Trends in upper-bound allocations of nutrition-specific sub-typologies across provinces, 2015 (USD)


