SUN CSA holds first county advocacy training

Kenya's Scaling Up Nutrition Civil Society Alliance (SUN CSA) in collaboration with the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) conducted the first county nutrition and food security advocacy training in West Pokot, North Rift region, from 26-29 August 2014.

The theme of the training was: 'Integration of Nutrition and Food Security Programming'.

A half-day advocacy workshop that brought together the county leaders, government officers, representatives of civil societies and non-governmental, preceded the training. SUN CSA and FAO facilitators highlighted the role of SUN Movement, importance of food security and nutrition, consequences of malnutrition to the society, County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP) and budgets to improve food security and nutrition.

The county leadership recognised that food insecurity and malnutrition are major issues affecting the county. Through different training sessions, participants agreed that each sector has a key role in tackling malnutrition and that the different sectors would work together for improved nutrition outcome in West Pokot County. They pledged to advocate for this with their organizations' leadership.

In his remarks, West Pokot Deputy Governor Titus Lotei affirmed that "Nutrition is a concern of all people and not a health issue only." Although there had been a slight improvement in the county's nutrition status, the Deputy Governor expressed his concern following the findings from the latest nutrition survey which revealed that West Pokot County had the second leading stunting (chronic malnutrition) rates in the country.



The County Speaker Robert Katina *(pictured above)* pledged his support for the legislation on nutrition issues and increase of resources to address malnutrition. He welcomed SUN CSA's call for increased funding in nutrition and pledged to present the same to the Members of County Assembly (MCA) to have their input in strategies to scale up nutrition.
