NUTRITION INVESTMENT SNAPSHOT: BANGLADESH



SUMMARY TABLE

Bangladesh's budgetary structure is derived from its National Food Security Plan, and comprises existing, ongoing and draft sectoral plans. The budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2016 analysis by Bangladesh identifies 117 programmes since 2010, of which 109 programmes received allocations in 2015, accounting for 14.28 per capita (all estimates are in USD).






