SUMMARY TABLE

Costa Rica's budgetary structure is aggregated at the sub-activity level. This means that each budget line item represents a sub-activity of a programme. With this information, the 2016 analysis identifies 14 sub-activities of 12 nutrition relevant programmes in 2015. The 12 sub-activities are overseen by three ministries, departments and agencies (MDA's) which allocated 72.46 per capita in 2015 (all estimates in USD).

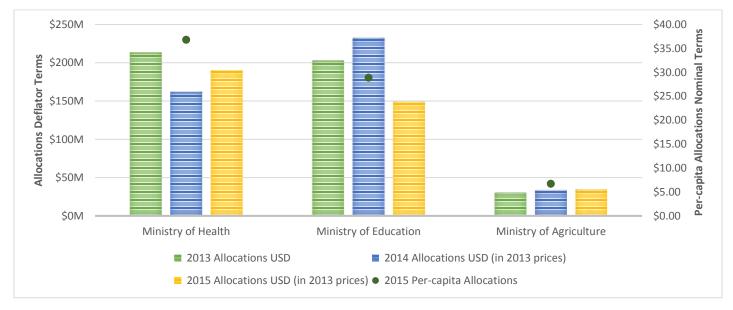

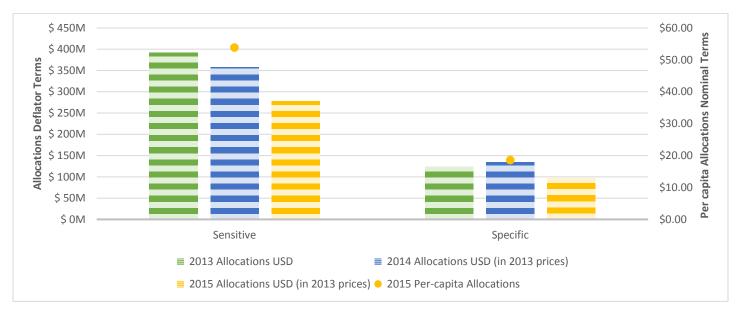

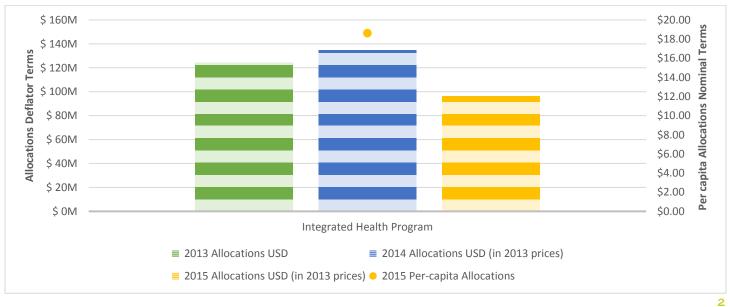

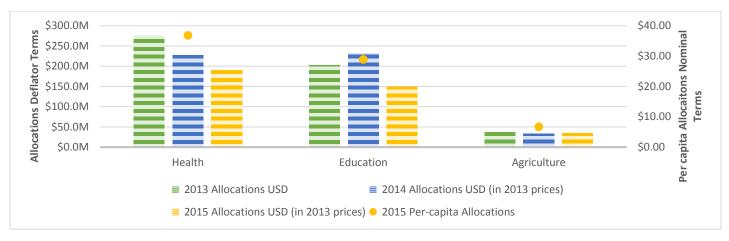

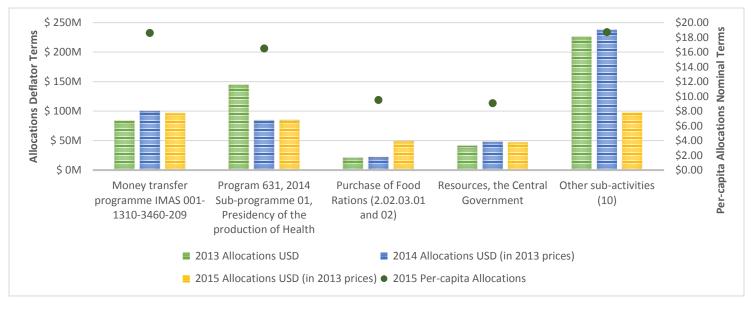
