

NUTRITION INVESTMENT SNAPSHOT: GUINEA-BISSAU



59 countries are leading a global movement to end malnutrition in all its forms.

SUMMARY TABLE

Guinea-Bissau's budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2016 analysis identifies 112 nutrition-relevant programmes, of which 96 programmes received allocations in 2014. The 96 nutrition-relevant programmes are overseen by fifteen ministries, departments or agencies (MDAs), which allocated 2.21 per capita in 2014 (all estimates in USD).

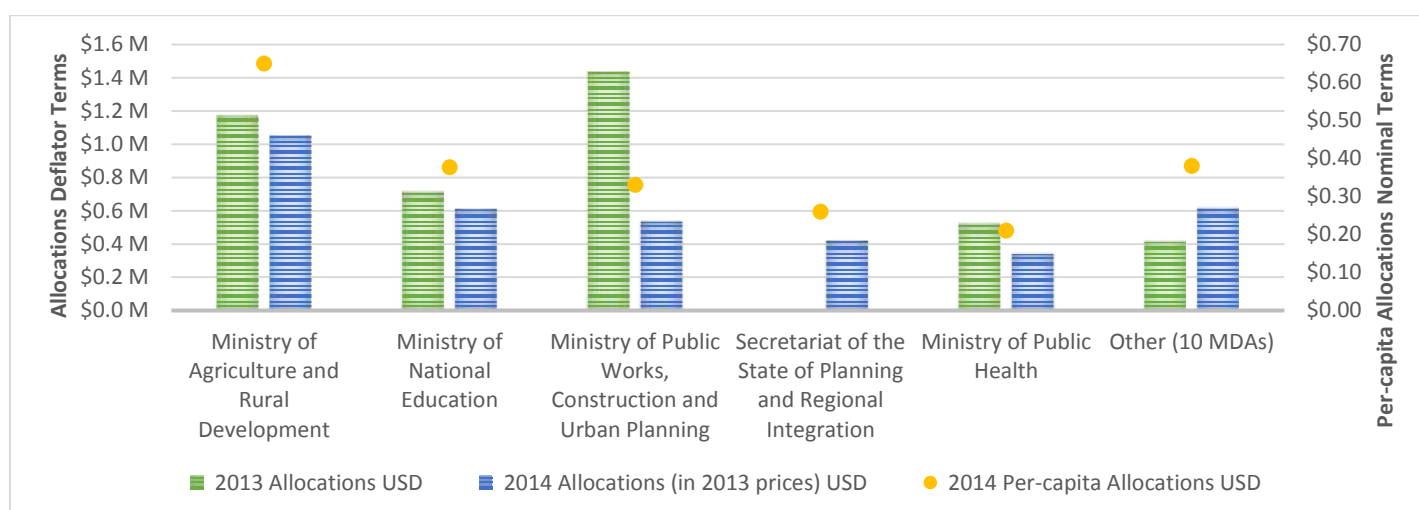

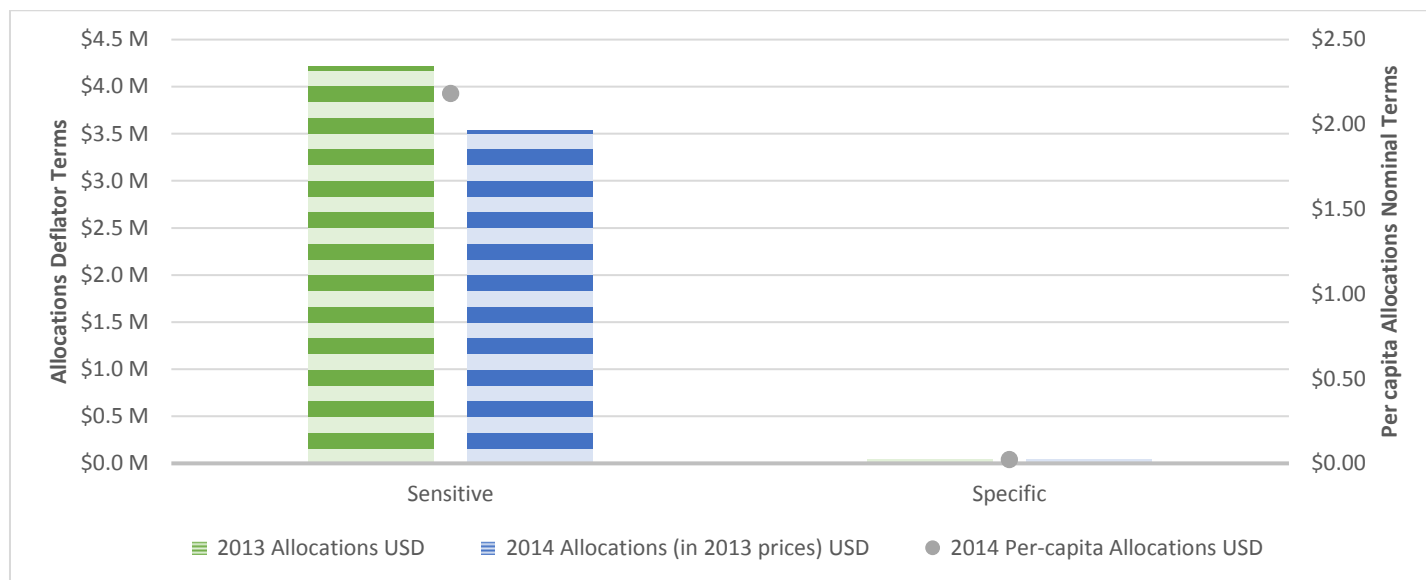

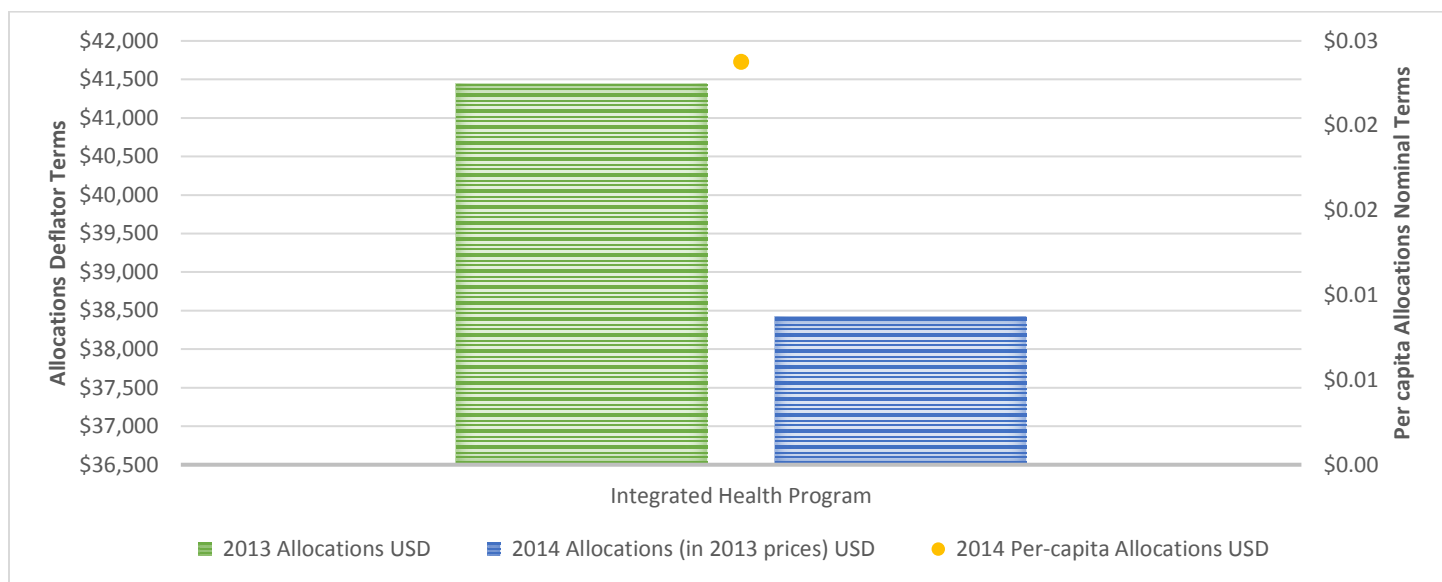

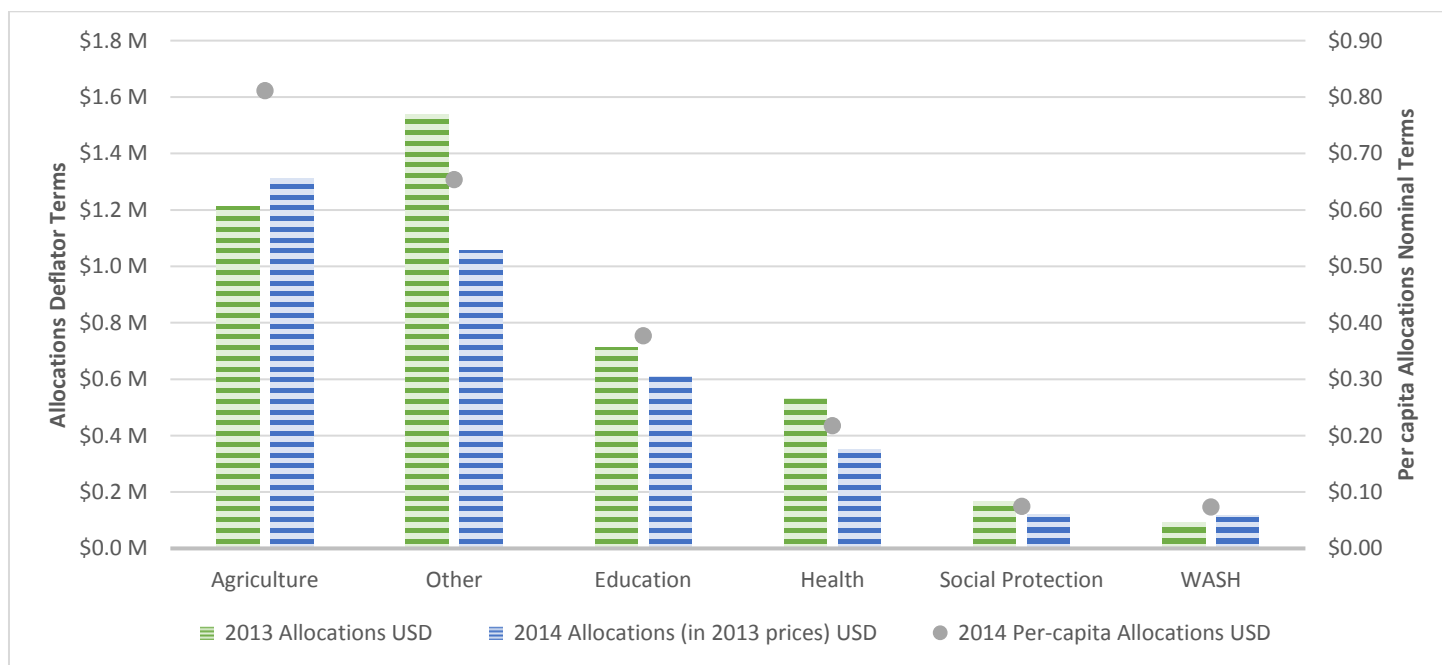
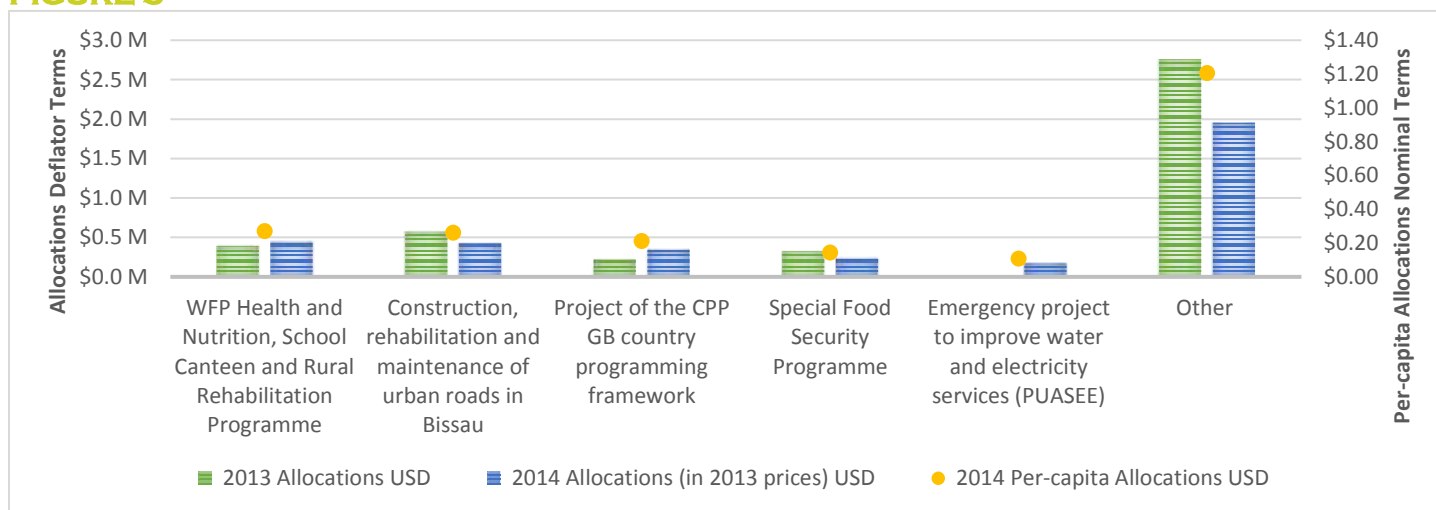
