60 countries are leading a global movement to end malnutrition in all its forms.

SUMMARY TABLE

Burundi's budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2018 budget analysis identifies 97 nutrition relevant programmes, of which 40 programmes received allocations in 2016.

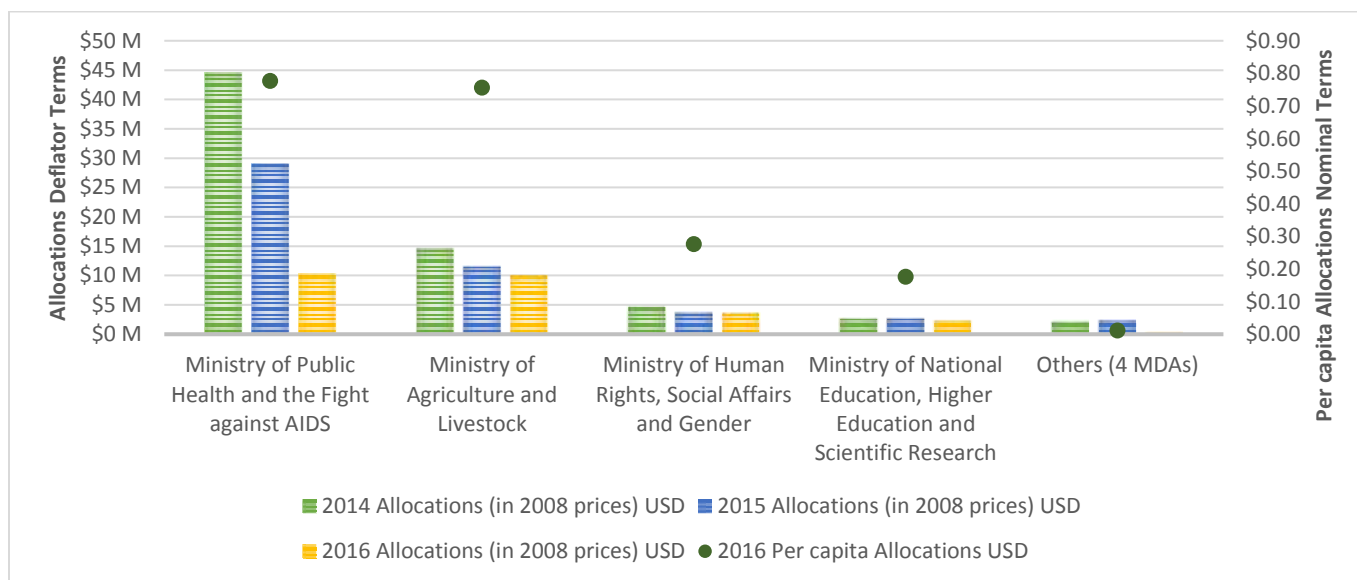
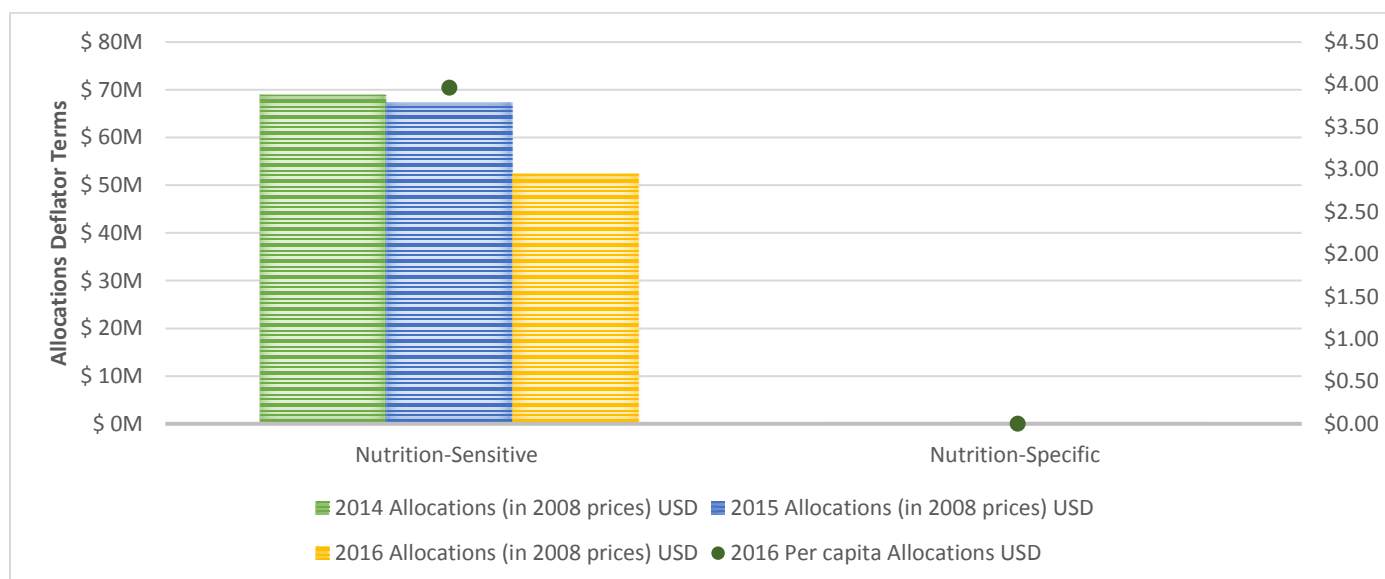

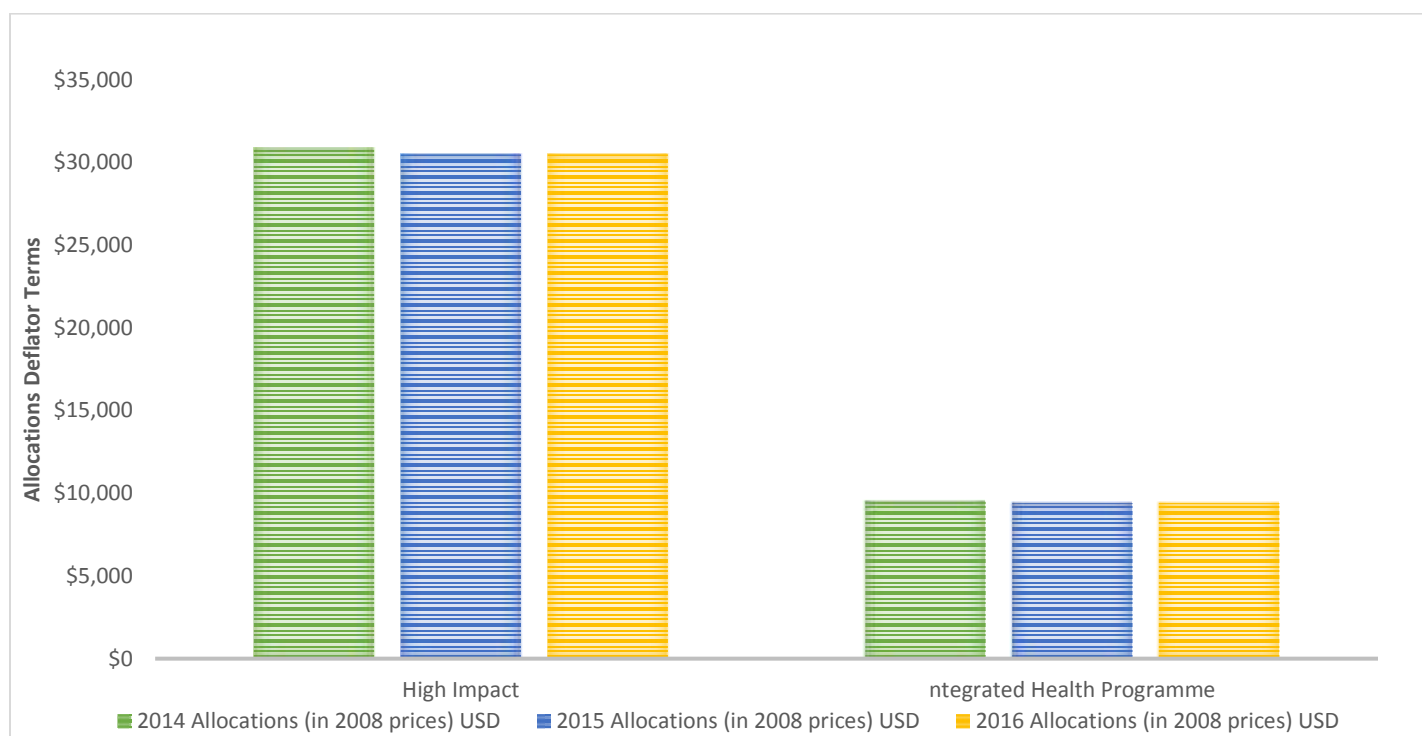

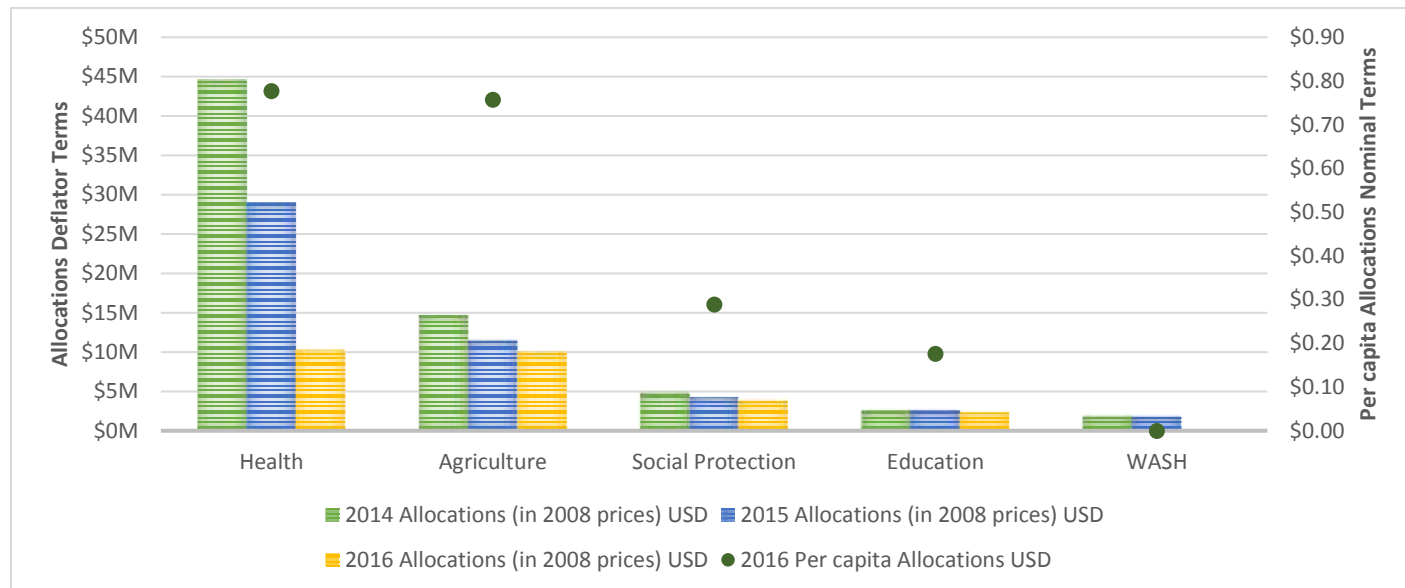

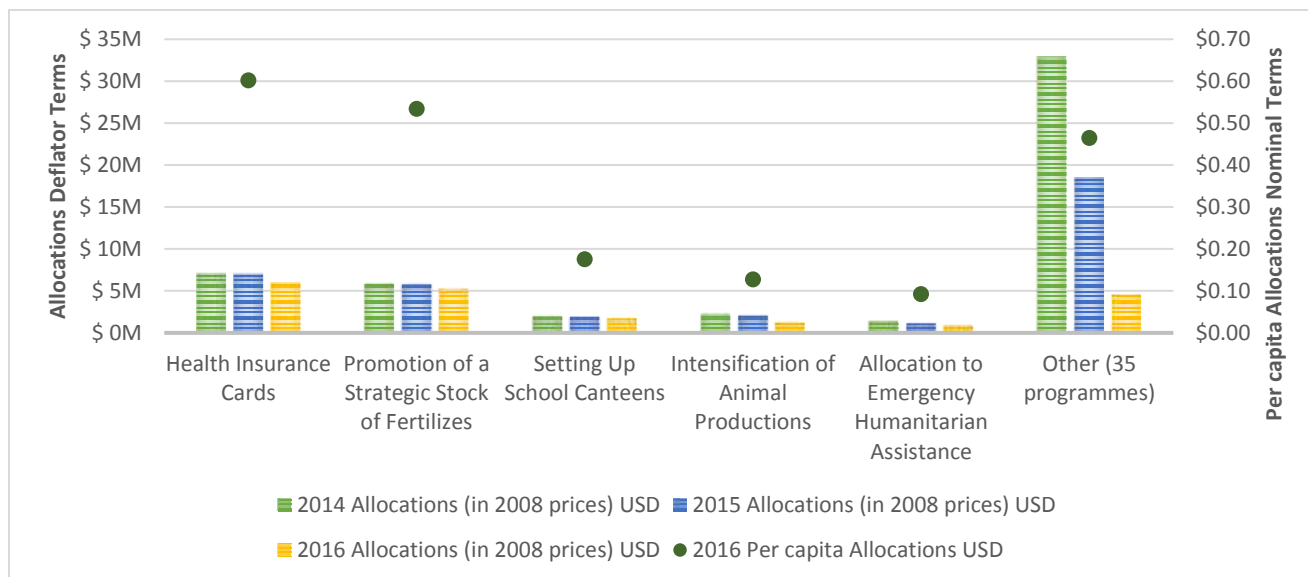
