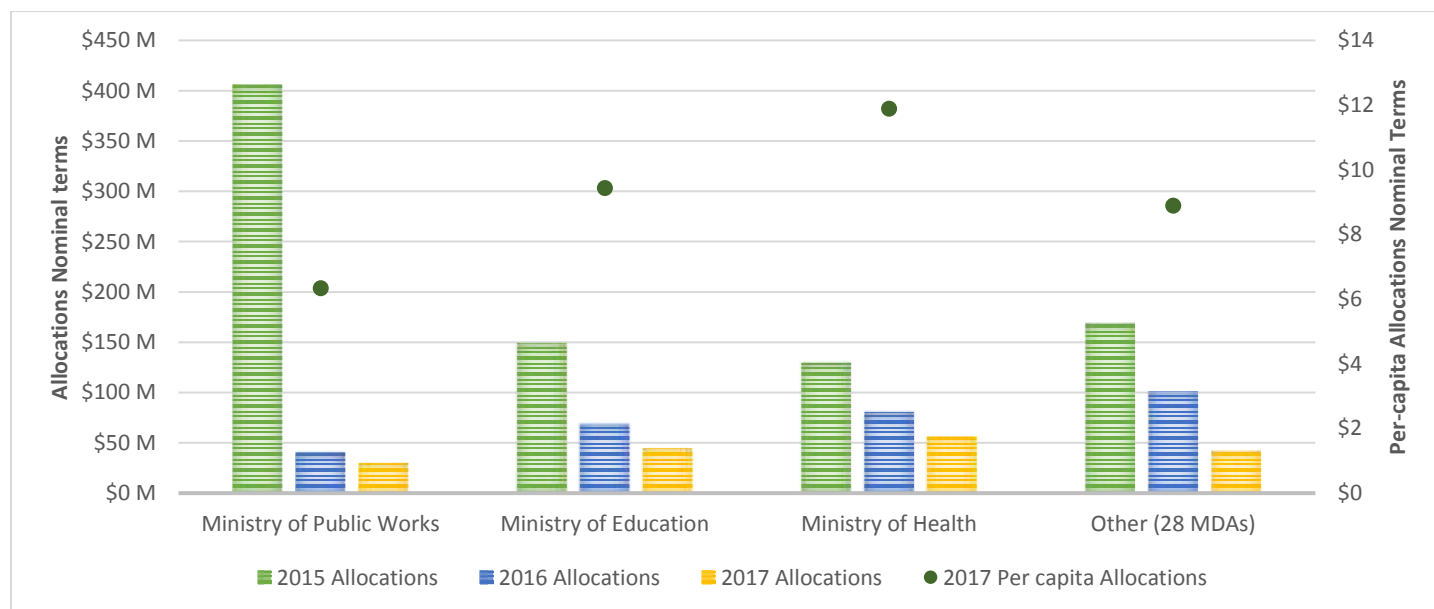
SUMMARY TABLE

Liberia’s budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2018 analysis identifies 81 nutrition-relevant programmes, of which 63 programmes received allocations in 2017. These 63 nutrition-relevant programmes are overseen by 29 ministries, departments and agencies (MDAs)¹, which allocated \$36.54 USD per capita in 2017.

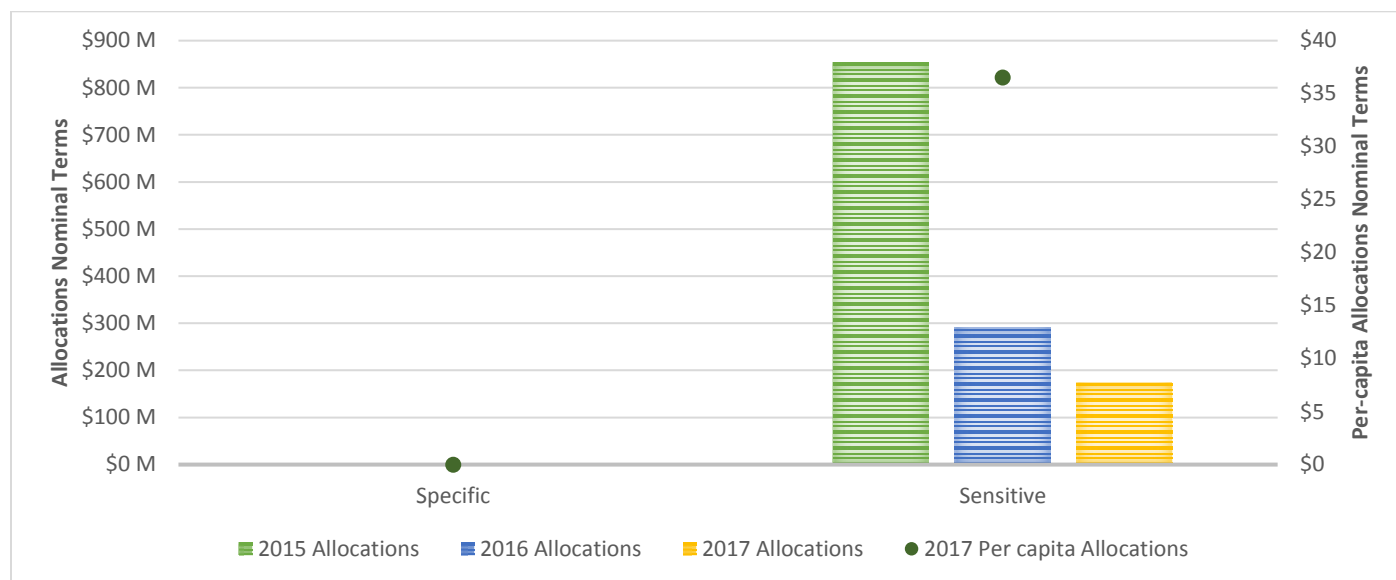

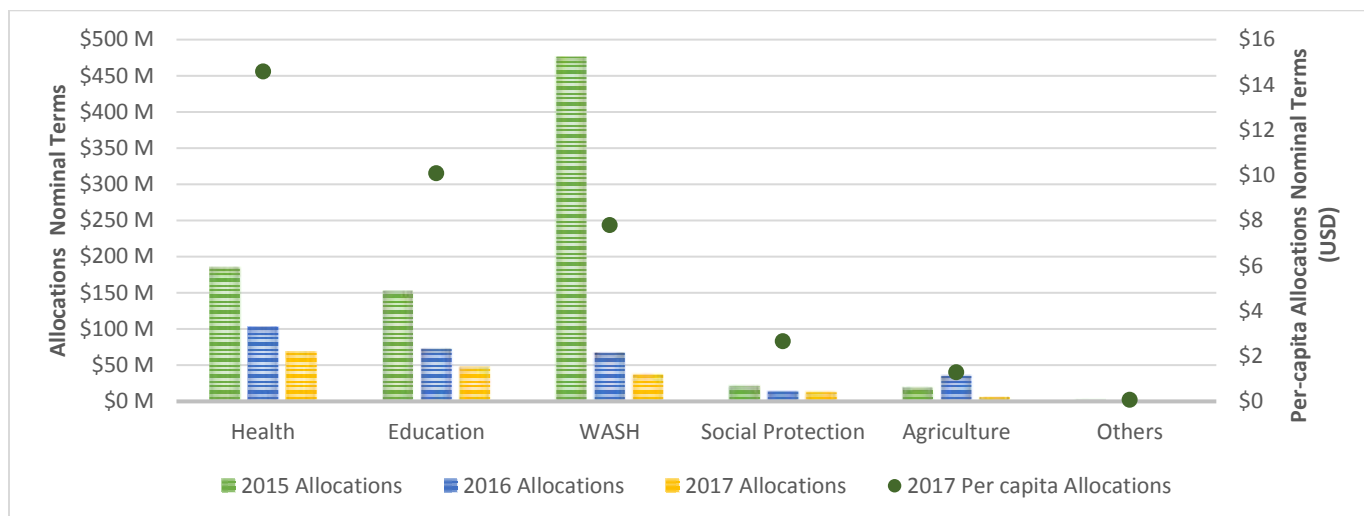

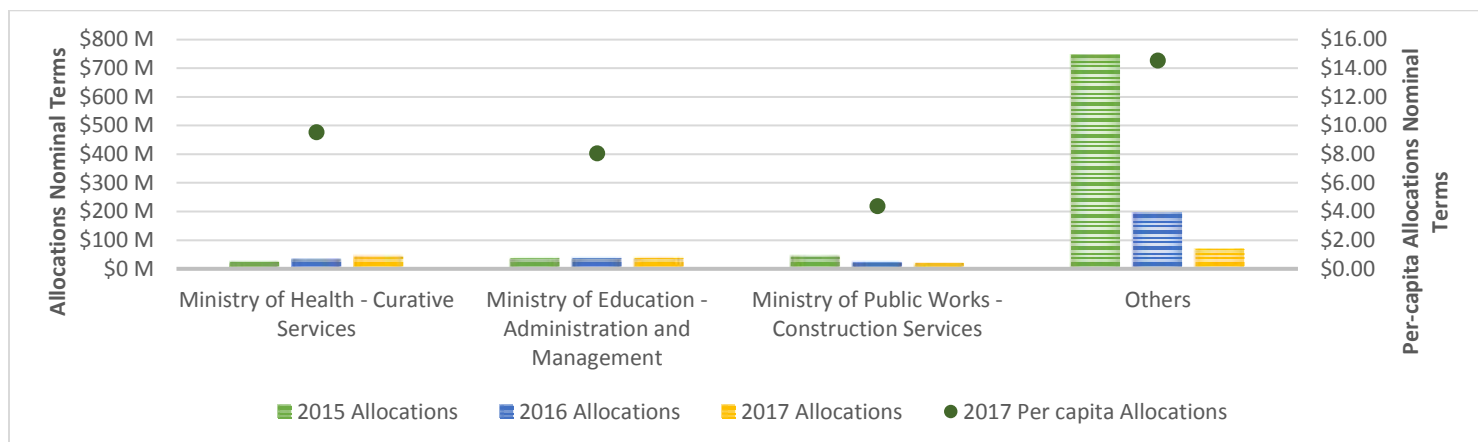
