59 countries are leading a global movement to end malnutrition in all its forms.

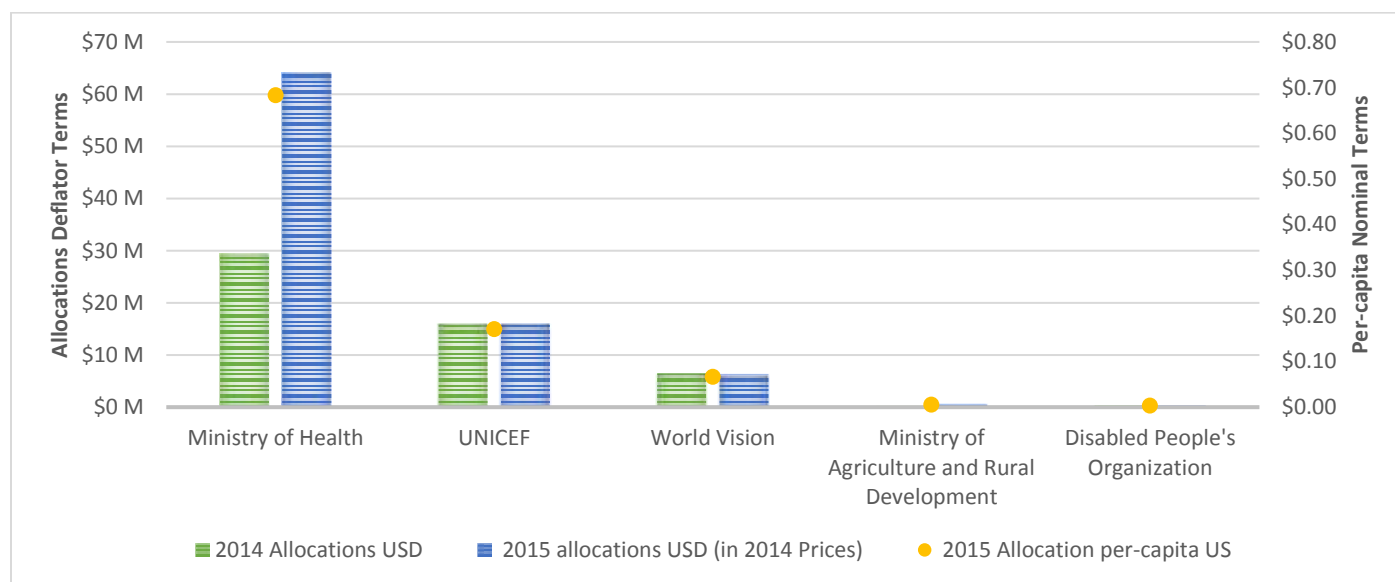
## SUMMARY TABLE

Viet Nam’s budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2016 analysis by Vietnam identifies 15 nutrition-relevant programmes managed by two identified ministries, departments and agencies (MDA’s) and three non-governmental organisations, which totalled 0.93 per-capita in 2015 (all estimates in USD).

## Trends in upper-bound nutrition-relevant allocations across MDAs, 2014 vs. 2015 (USD)

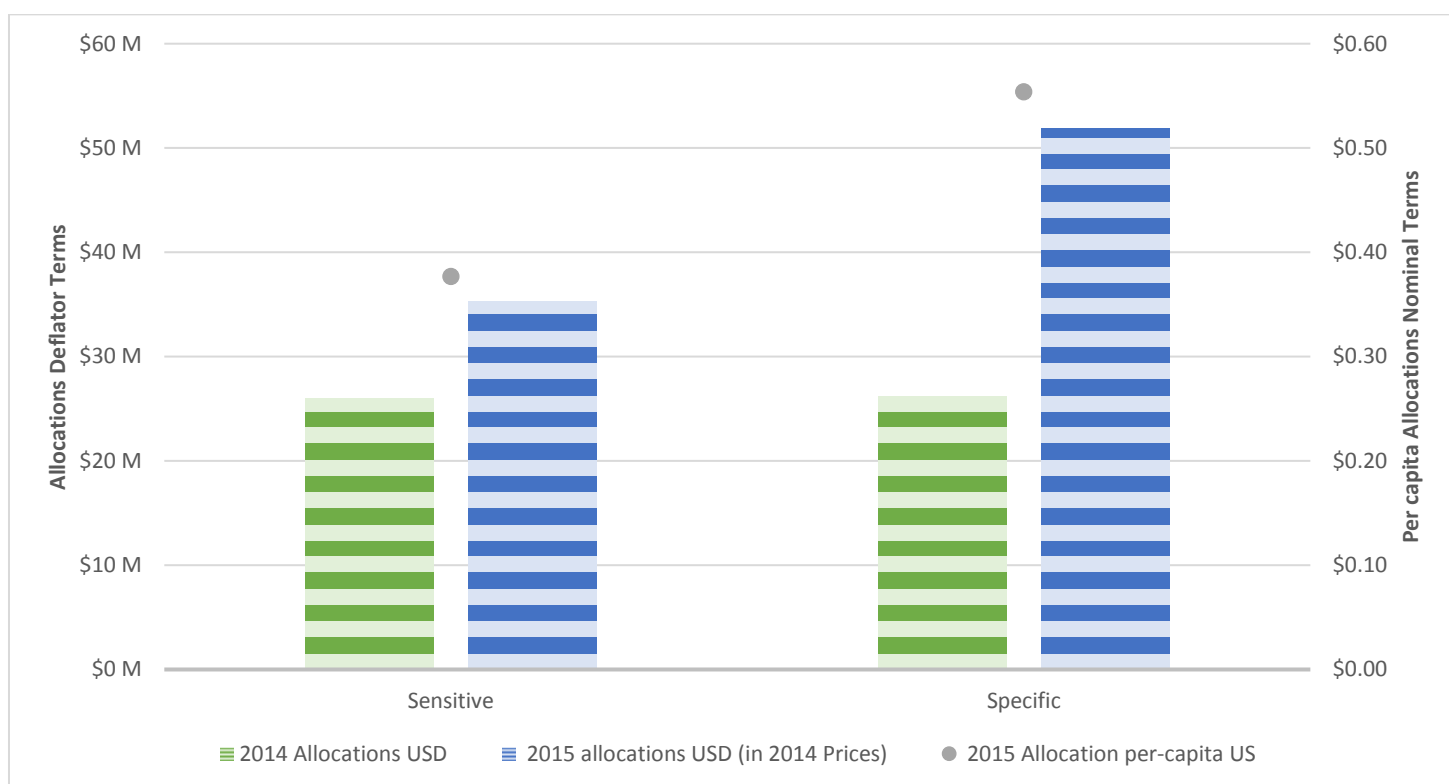

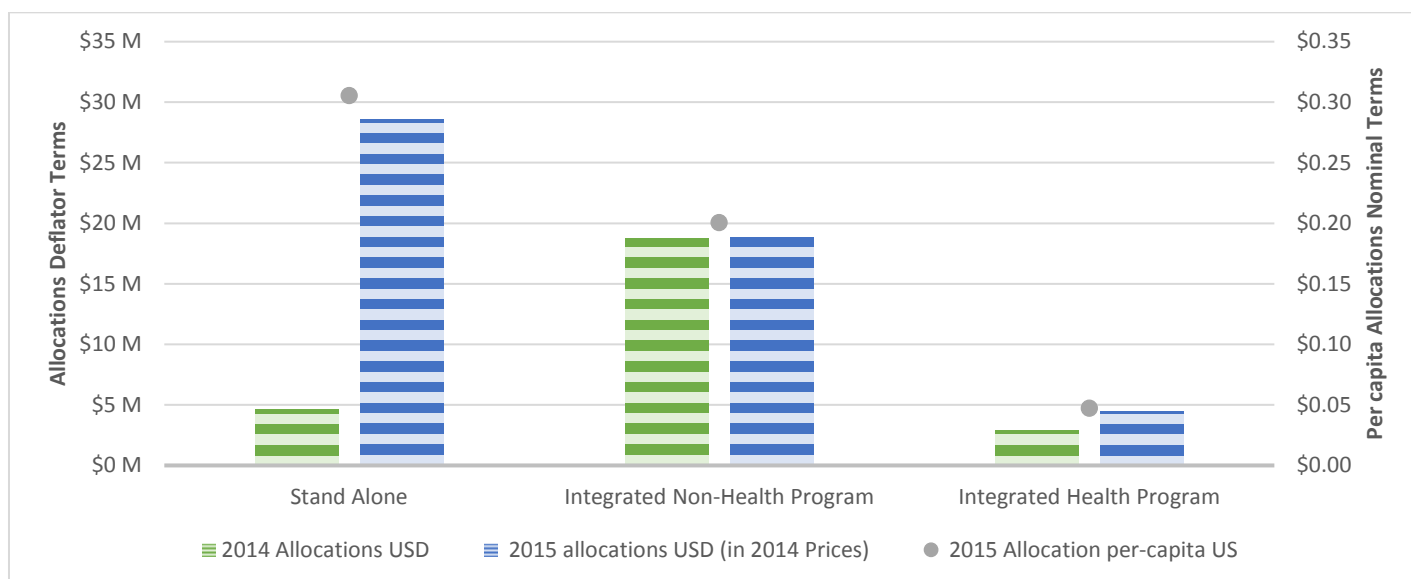
**FIGURE 2****TABLE 2**

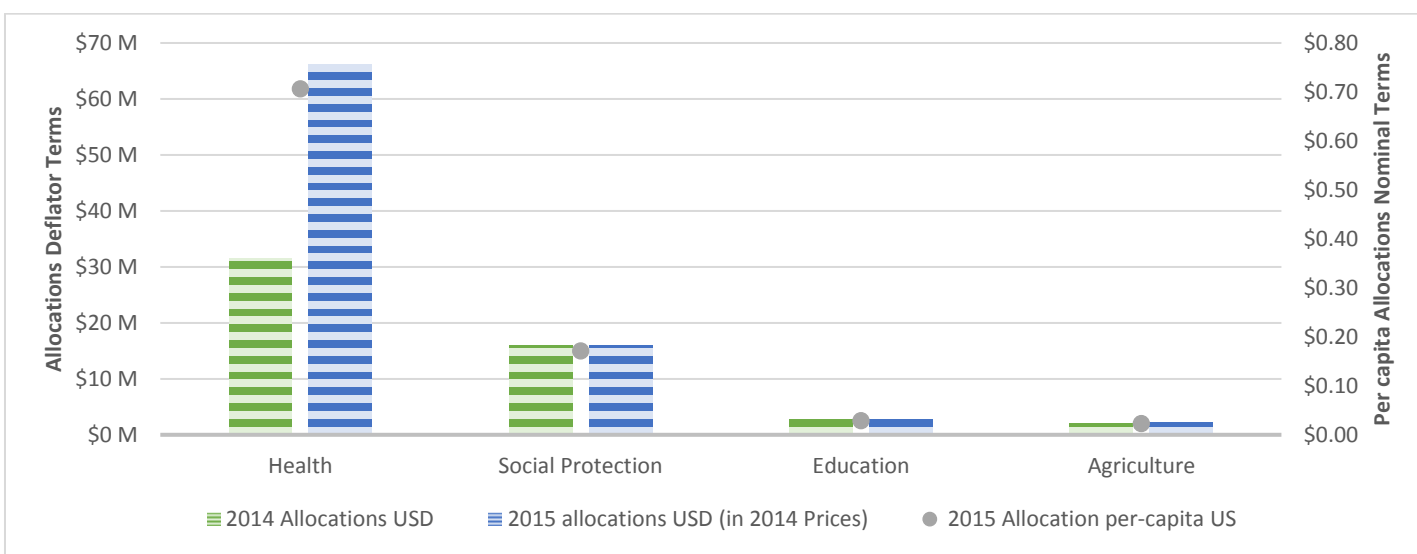

## Trends in upper-bound sectoral budget allocations, 2014 vs. 2015 (USD)

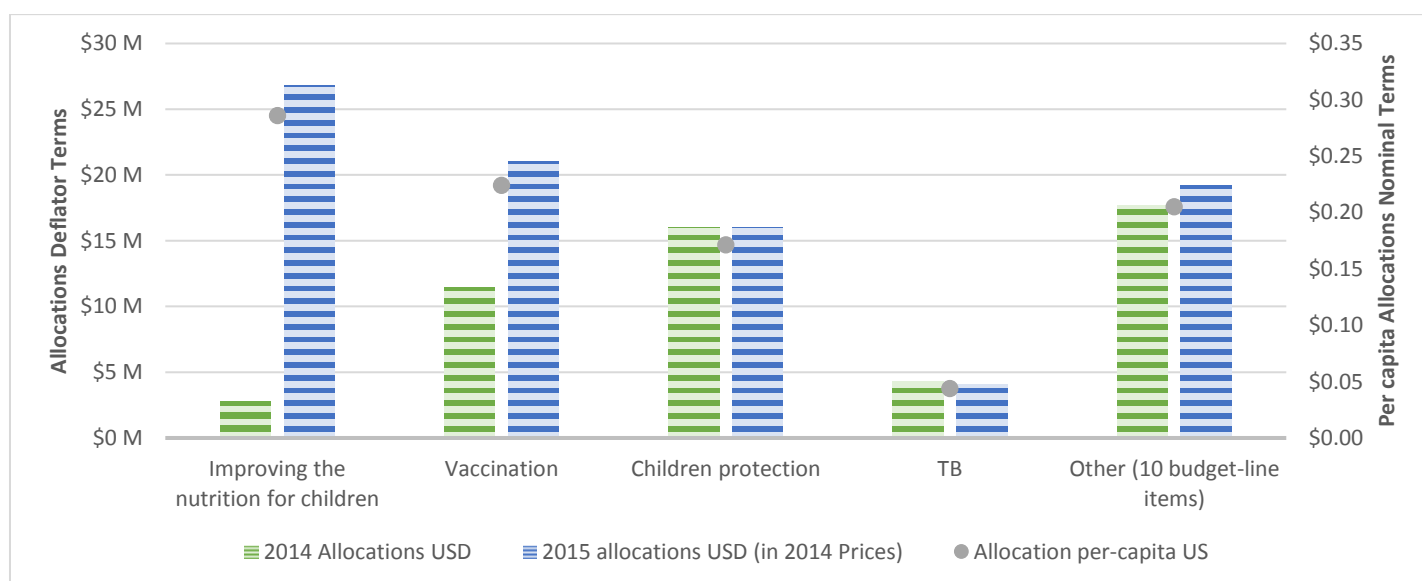
