

# NUTRITION INVESTMENT SNAPSHOT: CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC



50 countries are leading a global movement to end malnutrition in all its forms.

Central African Republic's budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2018 budget analysis identifies 29 nutrition relevant programmes, of which 24 programmes received allocations in 2016. The 24 programmes are overseen by a total of twelve ministries, departments or agencies which allocated \$1.81 USD in 2016 (all estimates in USD).

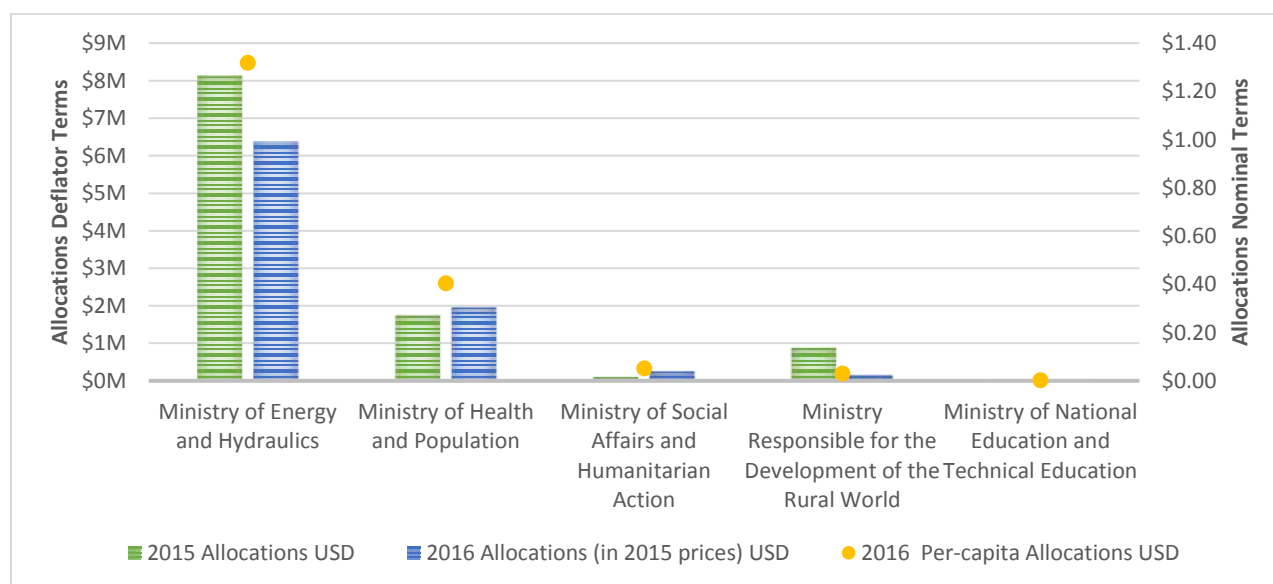

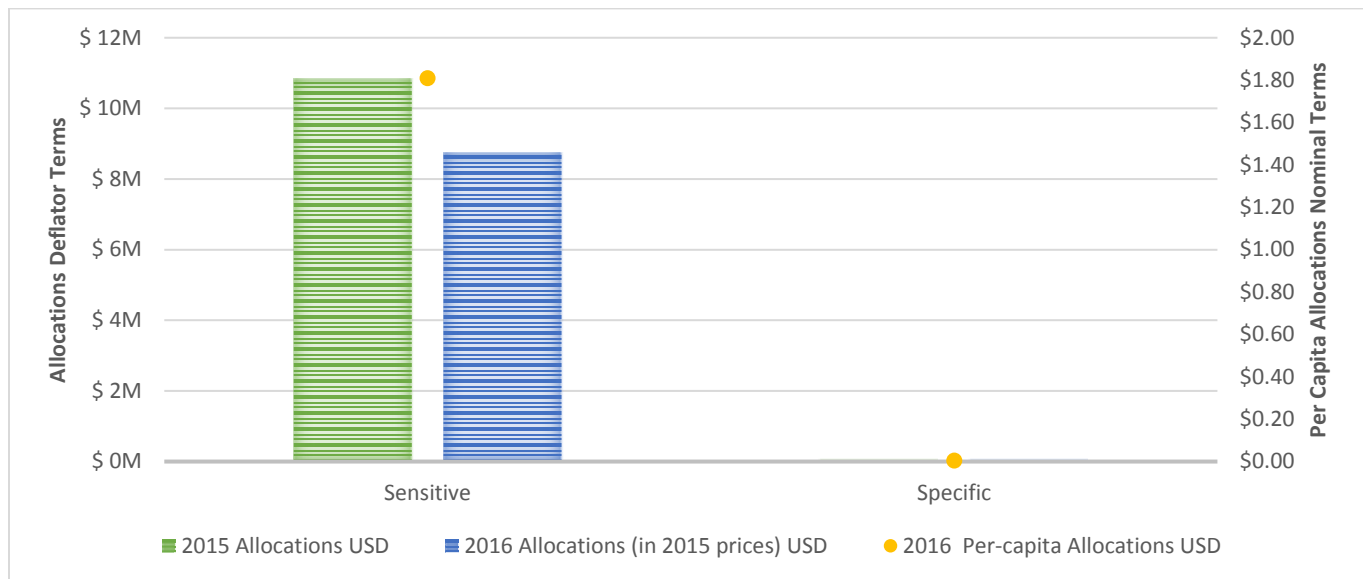
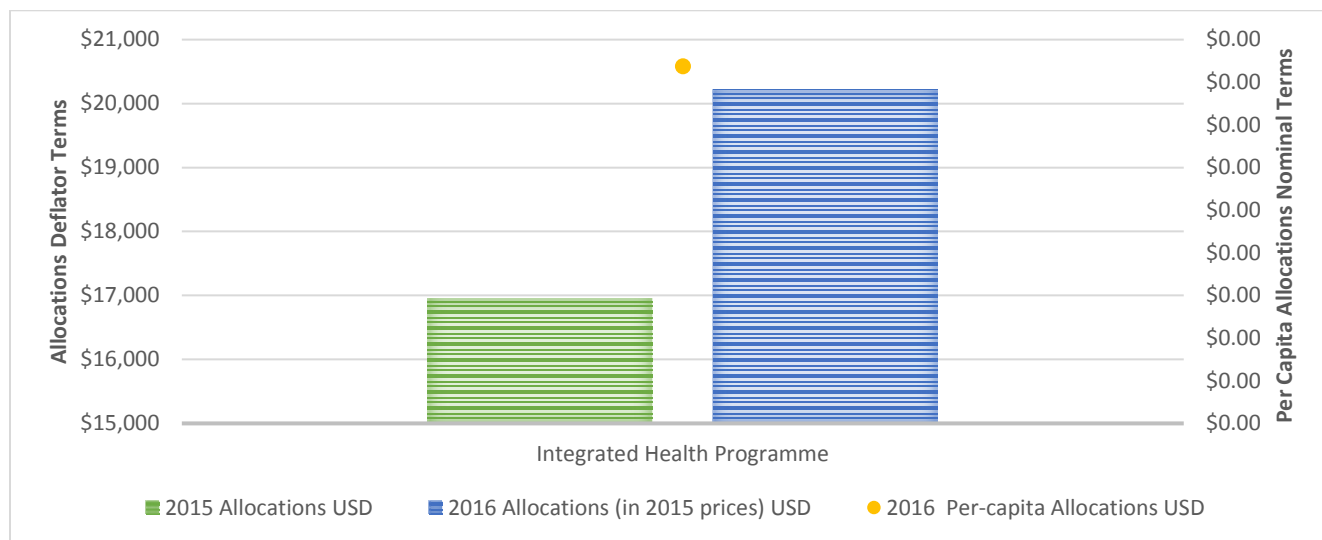

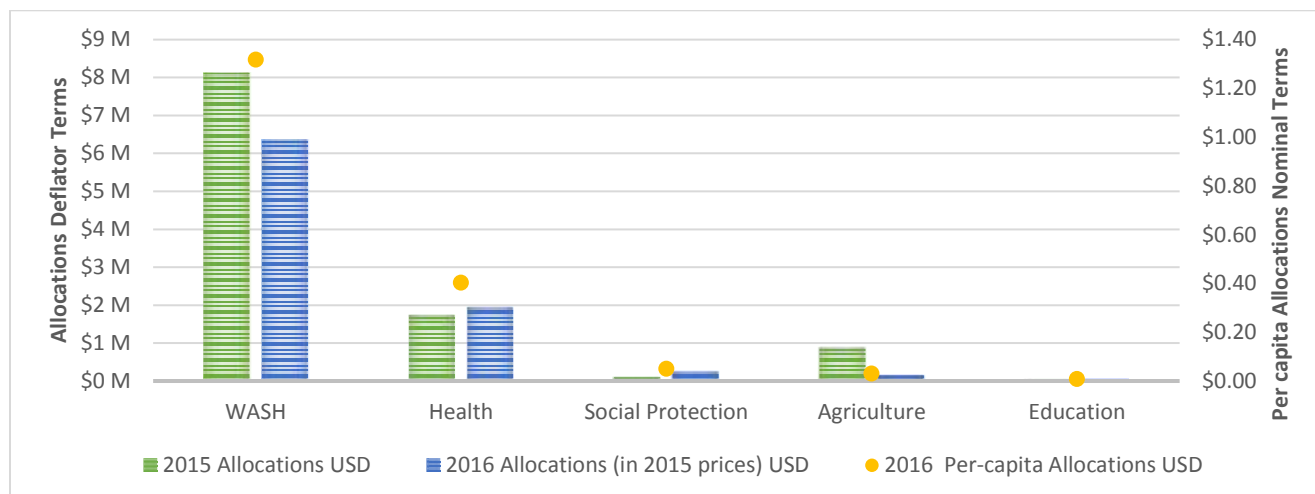

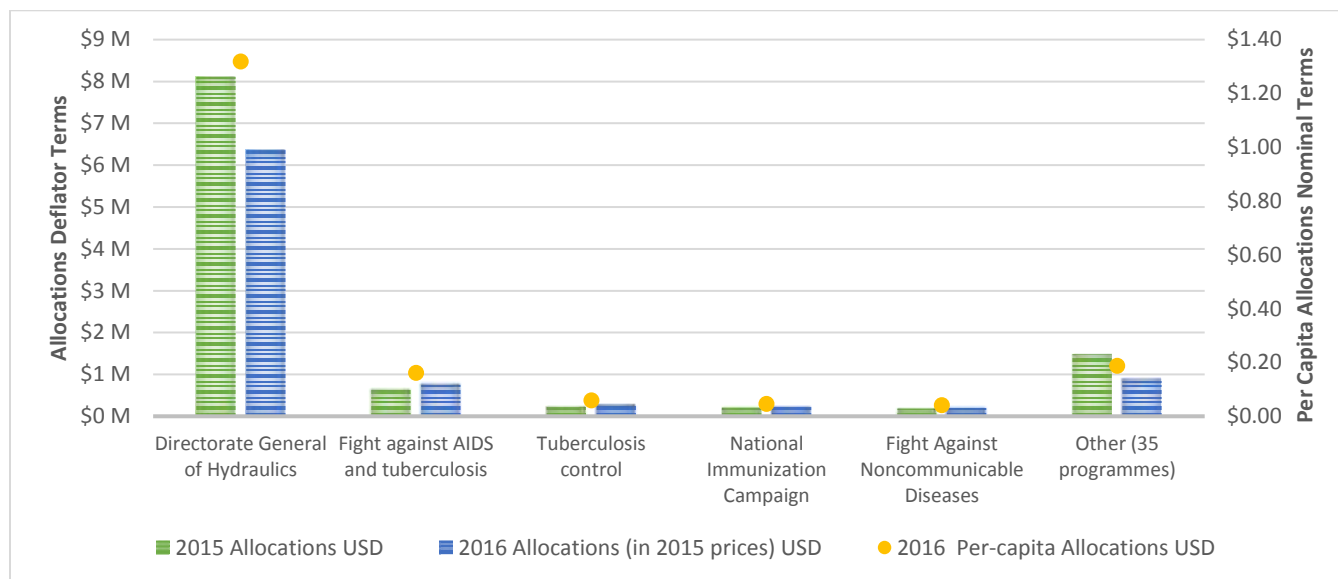
