

<p>A high-level Food Security and Nutrition (FSN) Forum was chaired by the First Vice-Prime Minister in May 2019. Participants included members of parliament, government, academia, business, civil society, local administration, donors and UN Agencies.</p> <p>An inter-sectoral working group, including representatives of all SUN Networks, drafted the new FSN programme.</p> <p>The SUN movement platform welcomed a Tajikistan MSP delegation for experience sharing.</p>	<p>The national Food Security and Nutrition Programme (FSNP) 2019-2023 was approved by the Prime Minister in June 2019 demonstrating a high-level commitment to nutrition.</p> <p>Analysis of existing policies and legislation in the field of nutrition is ongoing.</p> <p>Law on Breastfeeding Protection and on Universal Salt Iodization are being revised.</p> <p>A Food Safety Law is being developed.</p> <p>A series of FSN policy dialogues were organized by the UN and University of Central Asia, with the participation of the Government, academia, business, and civil society resulting in concrete recommendations.</p>	<p>An operational guideline for the management, coordination and monitoring of the FSNP 2019 - 2023 is in place.</p> <p>The global World Health Assembly targets for improving maternal, infant and young child nutrition, including anemia reduction, are integrated into the new FSNP 2019-2023 and are on track.</p> <p>Plans are being studied to tackle the double burden of malnutrition.</p>	<p>The FSNP 2019-2023 has been costed and 95 per cent funded, but mostly through donor funding.</p> <p>To ensure effective use of funds allocated to nutrition and food security analysis takes place and reports on expenditure on nutrition-specific and sensitive interventions are disseminated.</p>

2019-2020 PRIORITIES
